

SimTiki International Scholar Program FAQ

- The purpose of ISP is to provide scholars a more flexible experience than the Fellowship pathway by including fewer requirements, allowing the scholar to pursue independent scholarly activities while gaining a fundamental knowledge of simulation based educational methods.
- The International Scholar Pathway is more flexible thank the Simulation fellowship and allows scholars time to complete independent research or study, like a sabbatical.
- ISP may be a good choice if you do not plan to concentrate on simulation-based education upon completion of the program and value independent time to complete ongoing scholarly work, such as completing manuscripts or other activities.
- The program allows time to attend professional specialty society meetings or other professional activities if this is a priority for participants.
- ISP does include attendance at scheduled simulation educational sessions including Journal Club, Research meeting, SimBites, FunSim Faculty Development, Academy Colloquium series, etc.
- ISP scholars are not required to make presentations at SimTiki educational sessions and will not join the OME medical education fellowship.
- ISP scholars are required to create objectives for their program, and will meet monthly with a SimTiki Director to review progress
- ISP scholars have access to shared workspace at SimTiki
- ISP scholars will receive an International Scholar Certificate from the John a Burns School of Medicine Simtiki Simulation Center upon completion of the program.
